Exhibitors are asked to have the Blue Cattle Identity Card available for inspection, so as to verify the Date of Birth of any Exhibit, if requested to do so by the Ring Steward in charge. Entries in Pedigree Classes must show Name, Tattoo/Yellow I.D. Tag and Date of Birth on Entry Forms, Exhibitors in Commercial Classes are asked to show the Yellow Tag I.D. on the Entry Form of each Exhibit. Department of Agriculture and Food An Roinn Talmhaíochta agus Bia.

## **CMMS Notification Cattle Movement**

The movement of cattle to and from the Show must be recorded on CMMS using form CMMS 4 (forms available from your local DVO). Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling this requirement lies with the Show Secretary. The keeper of the animal(s) should complete 2 and 3(a) of the CMMS 4 form. Sections 3(b) should be completed by the Show Secretary and completed forms should be sent to the Cattle Movement Notification Agency within 7 days of movement in the pre-paid envelope supplied.
